Reports

President's report

A highlight for the Club was the opening of an exhibition of members' photographs at the Civic Library on 24 August. The exhibition, entitled *Visions of a Moment*, will be open until 25 September.

On behalf of the Club, I thank Nicky Bazley-Smith for organising the exhibition, from the initial conception through arrangements with Tash at the library, to the framing and layout design and logistics on the opening day. Nicky was helped by her family and a number of Club members in the practicalities of assembling then delivering the pictures to the library. Thanks also to the providers of morning tea and nibbles on the opening morning. Several members of the public I talked with at the opening were very complimentary about the quality of the images on display and the layout of the exhibition.

I have just returned from a birding trip to Julatten and the Daintree National Park. My original plan was to participate in this year's edition of a photography and printing workshop run by Les Walkling and colleagues in the park. Previous editions of this workshop have been attended by Tim Heenan and Rob Wignell, both of whom have reported very favourably on the experience.

Unfortunately, among many infrastructure problems caused by the '1 in a 1000-year flood' last December in the Cairns and Daintree region, access to the facility in the north of the National Park was cut, and the workshop was cancelled. However, I decided to retain the accommodation and travel bookings for a spell among the avian fauna of north Queensland anyway – and the weather was perfect, being dry and mid-20s for the week.

For our next meeting on Thursday, 19 September, Mark Stevenson will be talking about his approach and techniques for portrait photography.






